This week in science, pupils have been learning about metals and growing plants. Pupils have investigated the reactivity of different metals in order to deduce their own reactivity series.



Pupils have been preparing to start their new projects in Key Stage 3, the technology faculty are looking forward to practical lessons, starting next week with scones!




Art & Design


